Disability and the Academic Job Market Christopher McGunnigle, 2022 Disability and the Academic Job Market examines ableist structures in academia that inherently create obstacles to full time employment for people with a disability Based on historical and contemporary scholarship it has been shown how disclosure of a disability can have profound repercussions for a scholar with a disability Scholars with a disability are often inhibited from applying to or being promoted in academia because of direct discrimination negative perception towards people with a disability inaccessible physical and performance conditions and social models of disability that characterize disability as unproductive abnormal and risky While scholarship has addressed ableism in academia it has not strongly focused on the specific difficulties and barriers that a person with a disability faces when applying for a full time academic position This book seeks to provide a resource that brings to light ableist conditions in the academic hiring process through the lived experiences of scholars with a disability with hope to implement change in these situations This collection presents a combination of personal narrative and scholarship from academics with a disability who have navigated the academic job market with additional contributions from non disabled allies who have advocated for change in academic structures Our collection begins by expressing the concerned experiences of students entering the academic job market followed by scholars who have more fully lived through the obstacles of the academic market in both contingent and tenure track positions A vital focus of this collection is on intersectionality as chapters draw from interactions between disability and race gender and sexuality across international contexts Important topics discussed throughout the collection include systemic ableism disclosure the job interview academic workaholicism and lack of accommodations

Faculty Job Satisfaction Martha Wingard Tack, Carol Logan Patitu, 1992-05-12 Given the impending shortage of prospective college faculty that will exist by the year 2000 the topics of faculty job satisfaction recruitment and retention must be given priority attention Moreover the faculty of the future must reflect the diversity of the population to be served consequently immediate actions must be taken to ensure that faculty positions are made attractive to women and minorities alike Numerous internal stressors uniquely affecting women and minorities must be recognized and dealt with to enhance job satisfaction and create a better fit between the faculty role and the person involved It has been shown that women faculty members are less satisfied with their positions than their male counterparts because they are often forced to sacrifice more in terms of their personal lives in order to meet the demands of their jobs as well as their families As for minority faculty members they generally find themselves less likely to be tenured compared to whites are often concerned about lower salaries feel isolated and less supported and often encounter prejudice and racism Leaders and faculty in higher education must implement a variety of recruiting and retention strategies if a faculty representing a diverse culture is to become a reality Actions include 1 recruiting women and minorities into undergraduate and graduate programs in sufficient numbers to fill the pool for faculty positions 2 attracting women into disciplines where they are currently underrepresented and 3 using incentives for departments to diversify Contains an index and over 200 references GLR
