not only followed closely Smith's own narrative of what occurred but have made use of the very words in which he recorded the conversations. For instance, the incident related on page 101 was set down by Smith himself on pages 144-154-262; the words are those of Smith as given in his history on pages 173-195-260-300; the words of Powhatan or Pocahontas as Smith relates them.
