VISUALIZING

As you read, pause to visualize a concept, character or scene. This can be done through mental imagery and talking. "What do you picture the dog to look like? Why? What does the room look like?" Or, take a moment to draw a picture.

SELF-MONITORING

Teach your child to pause and monitor their reading. Does what I just read make sense? This ability to self-check and self-monitor their reading is so essential!

MAKING CONNECTIONS

What connections can be made with their own experiences? How can they relate what they are reading to their own background knowledge?

SUMMARIZING/RETELLING

Ask your child to retell in his or her own words what just happened.

ASKING QUESTIONS AND MAKING PREDICTIONS

What do you wonder about? What do you want to know more about? What do you need clarification on? And, what predictions can you make?
