

## Chapter 7 Assessment 1

1. Read 7.4 pages 159-161. Using only your textbook describes how molecules enter the nucleus in 3-5 sentences.
  - Molecules that are smaller, like nucleotides, can pass through very easily going through the nuclear pores into the nucleus. The larger molecules are imported a little more selective meaning that it allows some to enter and others not to enter. The larger proteins and RNA are the ones that have to go under the selective process while entering the nucleus unlike the smaller nucleotides.
2. Read 7.5 Cell Systems II and using only your textbook describe how the endomembrane system manufactures, ships, and recycles cargo. Please use a minimum of four sentences for your answer.
  - The proteins arrive at the ER where they are synthesized by a ribosome and then exit the ER. Then the proteins enter the Golgi apparatus for more modification then they exit and continue the process. The proteins a distinct "tag" and are sorted in the trans-Golgi cisterna and into a transport vesicles bud where these buds attach and fuse at different destinations. Once the proteins reach the receptor-mediated endocytosis they are bonded to macromolecules outside of the cell. Then continuing on to the phagocytosis bringing smaller cells to form a phagosome, and then entering the autophagy where they enclose a damaged organelle inside the membrane.
3. Read 7.6 and then list and describe the three types of filaments found in the cytoskeleton.
  - Three types of filaments are microtubules, intermediate filaments, and actin filaments.
    - Microtubules are a hollow tube with the subunits of alpha- and beta-tubulin dimers. Its functions include maintaining the shape by pushing, moving the cells with cilia, moving chromosomes during cell division, assisting the formation of the cell plate during cell division, and provide tracks for transport.
    - Intermediate filaments are fibers that wound into thicker cables with subunits of keratins, Lamins, and others. Its function is to maintain the shape by pulling and anchor nucleus and some other organelles.
    - Actin filaments are two strands that are coiled with the subunit of action. Its functions are to maintain the cell structure by pulling, moving cells with muscle contractions/cell crawling, divide animal cells into two, move organelles and cytoplasm in plants, fungi, and animals.
